


Castle Chronicle Christmas 2020

Park your troubles, worries and concerns at the back of the Chapel and absorb the incredible messages that a child was born 2020 years ago, who altered our understanding of what it means to be human. Forever. He has promised that he will always 'Be There' for us.

These meanings of 'Be There' are very relevant to living and growing up in a boarding community. At a recent conference I attended, one of the speakers said that boarding is a "very powerful form of education". It goes way beyond academics and is a truly holistic experience. As a community of parents and professional educators we have an opportunity to influence for the better the values and beliefs of boys at a very impressionable age. During a recent interview with an overseas applicant a parent paid Blackrock potentially the greatest compliment I have ever heard. When I asked her why she wanted her son to come here, she immediately said "Because I have been told by friends in Ireland that you produce kind and caring men, with strong values". *Being There* is one of those values.

I thank you all who have contributed to this special community over the past few months. The Parents, Housemasters, Chaplain, Care-coordinator, and Nurses, who are 'There' for the boys on a daily basis. We also thank our support staff, who work tirelessly on our behalf. And finally, to our exceptional College management, who never falter in their support of the Castle. Nollaig Shona Dhaoibh Go Léir!!
