It has been an extraordinary couple of weeks at Blackrock. A highlight was the S.C.T's stellar performance against a gallant Gonzaga. The quality of play has been well documented, but it was matched by the superb welcome they received on their return to the College, rapturous celebrations that one associates with victory, and it was well deserved. The previous Monday our J.C.T made the same journey back to the College. A different result but a similar reception in appreciation of the effort they made, the courage and heart they displayed. Kipling's message is that both success and setback are fleeting. It is the journey that counts, the challenges confronted, the burdens shared, the lessons learnt, the spirit engendered.

On both occasions the squad members spoke of their gratitude to family, coaches, teammates and friends for their support and encouragement. At the Junior celebration, the audience may have been smaller and the singing less ecstatic but nonetheless, as much as any other occasion, it defined us.

That week had other encounters with "those two impostors". We are equally proud of our U'16 Gaelic team that was beaten by Gaelcholáiste Reachrann in their Dublin Championship final on the Thursday, of our Senior Soccer team that recorded a 4-3 win after extra-time over Coláiste Pobail Setanta, in the Dublin Metropolitan league on the Friday, of our junior debating team that lost to Holy Child Killiney that evening, and on the Saturday morning, of the 160 plus entrants who went the distance in aid of Aidlink and Cystic Fibrosis Ireland in the Rock 5K. On the Sunday, while most of us were in the RDS, our rowers competed with pride and success at the Commercial Regatta and our MUN team won the 'Outstanding Delegation Award' at the St. Andrew's International Conference.

Also, that week 4th and 5th Year families welcomed 18 boys from Holy Ghost Prep. Philadelphia into the homes, 19 5th Years were on the Camino, we celebrated 'Seachtain na Gaeilge' and rehearsals continued apace for the Junior musical. And what a show that turned out to be with 'craic agus ceol' in 'Irish College Uncovered'!

Our Addiction Awareness Day and the sacrament of reconciliation liturgies added significant value to the wellbeing of our boys as we completed the term.

The range of activity is quite simply extraordinary, and I haven't referenced the mock orals, the classes and games that happen each day nor the buzz created by the return of our bees to active service. Blackrock is a hive of activity.

We have much to celebrate but at the same time we are acutely aware of the awful tragedy unfolding in Ukraine, the scale of the brutality and the desolation. It is uplifting to see and read about so many rallying around the Ukrainian people. Indifference is not an option.

Easter is a season of hope. We pray that the risen Christ will inspire all peoples to put aside destructive ways to make room for a better self and a better world. We are an Easter people and Jesus died on the cross not for all of us but for each one of us. His death and resurrection are a personal invitation to have a living, vibrant, albeit at times demanding, relationship with our Saviour, shaped by the Holy Spirit. Fulfilment and happiness will follow.

I recently came across the following definition of happiness:

"It is to thank God every morning for the miracle of life. It is the maturity to be able to say that I made a mistake; it is to have the courage to say I am sorry, the confidence to say I need you, the awareness to say thank you." (Anon.)

This is the Easter message. Be happy. Live in the spirit. Be Grateful. God loves us.





The focus of Green Schools this term was awareness raising about Litter, Waste and Recycling in the College. On our return from Midterm, we held the second **Environmental Awareness Week (EAW)** of the year which was a huge success. Our main theme for the week was **'Litter, Waste and Recycling'** and this is our focus for our next flag. On Tuesday the theme was 'Plastic Waste', Wednesday was 'Fast Fashion and Clothing Waste', Thursday was 'Electronic Waste' and on

Friday the theme was 'Food Waste'.

Green Schools organised an event or activity for students each day. On Tuesday all students were asked to complete a Kahoot quiz centred around **plastic waste**. Senior (non-exam) RE and TY RE students watched a brilliant movie called **'The Great Green Wall'**. On Wednesday a short clip was shown to classes explaining **fast fashion and clothing waste**. We



teamed up with **ClothesPod.ie** and provided collection points where students could bring in used/unwanted clothes. The funds raised from the clothing collection were donated to Spirasi.

On Thursday we planned a **Beach Clean-up** but the tide was in, so 4th Years did a **Blackrock Park clean-up** instead and we also launched our **battery recycling** initiative. The committee made a video that was shown to classes highlighting the locations of our battery recycling boxes. We encourage all students and staff to drop off their used batteries regularly.

Archives Update

Archivists and researchers all over the world appreciate the many benefits the digitisation of records brings. While many records made today are 'born digital' (i.e. produced and accessed in digital formats), digitised records are the scanned versions of records originally produced in hard copy, such as printed or hand-written documents, photographic negatives, glass plates or developed photographs. Other analogue records include cassette and VHS tapes. Most of the collection at Blackrock College Archives is in this format. Digitised and web-accessible records promote greater access to these records and reduces the physical handling of fragile records. The accessibility of digitised records was brought into greater focus in March 2020 when Covid-19 forced the closure of most archives. Scanning a hard-copy record produces a new digital object that requires preservation, as issues such as hardware and format obsolescence, the application of descriptive labels (metadata), security and storage must be built into their management.

Over the past ten years or so Blackrock College Archives has been digitising some of its frequently accessed records and plans for the digitisation of many more is envisioned for the period 2023-2025. Daily requests are received from past students and researchers for copies of the college annual, a publication that has been in production since 1930. The college's very old and fragile photographic albums, some of which date back as far as

1866, have had each of their photographs scanned so that reduced access to the originals is ensured, thus safeguarding their bindings and reducing exposure to harmful UV rays. Candidates for digitisation in the near future include old financial ledgers

We also sent out a poster to the Year Group Teams to provide students with **tips on how to conserve energy** when using their Surface Go's. We had a **Litter Patrol** each day at lunchtime and were delighted to see so many Second Years volunteering their time. Finally, we sent a **survey to all students and staff** asking for feedback on how we can improve our litter and waste collection in the College. We were very happy with the response rate and will use the data collected to create our Action Plan. Overall, it was a very successful week, and we raised a lot of awareness

listing enrolled students from 1862 and annuals produced in the period 1904-1909. The latter, known as the 'Keawell Annuals', were spearheaded by Fr James Keawell (1861-1942). These annuals served as combined prospectus, summary of prize winners, photographs of teams and societies, and the listing of students in the Civil Service College (Castle) or past students gone on to greater appointments. They are a valuable source of data for researchers. Their current state (as the illustrations show) is very fragile.





Researching De Valera

Ms A. Dillon teamed up with Dr Jessica Cunningham from archives for a talk on researching De Valera to Mr Byrne's TY History Class. Ms A. Dillon spoke about indexes and highlighted websites that might help students in their research including scoilnet.ie, Dictionary of Irish Biography and Ask About Ireland.

Researching Information on the Russian-Ukraine conflict

Students were shown techniques to verify images and videos such as reverse image search and geo location.

Highlights will include the staging of the Teacher vs Student Debate, the Fourth/Fifth Year Gold Medal Debates, and the Sixth Year Centenary Medal Debate. We are also looking forward to a collaboration with Holy Child, Killiney for a friendly debate at the beginning of May.
