Dear Parents.

Recently, I came across an article in the 1965 College Annual written by the late John Coyle. Celebrated Artist, renowned Art Teacher (1951-91), and first lay Vice-Principal (1972-91) at Blackrock, he wrote that he was pleased that, at last, Art had "ceased to be an 'extra' and holds its place as an essential element in some form or other in any proper formal education." He quoted the French painter Eugene Carriére- "A student's own talent, if one can help him to find it and experience it, is the best gift that one can make him." Both John Coyle and Eugene Carriére were well ahead of their time as what they promulgated is the currency of education today.

Professor William Damon, Stanford University, has written extensively on the importance of a sense of purpose in life. He defined this purpose as what you are interested in, what matters to you and what takes you beyond

Over the past 6 weeks, our Machakos immersion programme, the visit of boys from and to Holy Ghost Prep, Philadelphia, the Wesley Music Festival and M.U.N. conference; the concert in Christ Church Cathedral, Environmental Awareness Week and Addiction Awareness Day, the 5K RockRun, debates and Dungeons and Dragons, state orals and practicals have revealed character, prompted purpose, sparked interest. And of course, day-by-day classroom engagement is at the heart of this.

The schools' cup finals left us with contrasting emotions. Oliver Coffey's Senior, and Matthew Wyse's Junior squads had very different experiences, yet both were received back in the College afterwards in the same fashion by family, staff and friends. We are very proud of both groups as we are of all our teams across rowing, soccer, rugby, gaelic games, badminton, basketball, table-tennis, swimming, cross-country and chess.

Education is about acknowledging that everyone has a talent and the search for that talent. I thank my Colleagues, the Parents' Association, Community and Union who fuel that spark and encourage your sons to lead a purposeful life.

And so, to a well-deserved break;

May the risen Lord spark in each one of us hope, optimism, acceptance and understanding.

A Competitive start to the Rock Run!





Rugby School International Sevens Festival

To celebrate the bicentenary of the game of rugby in its birthplace Rugby School, Blackrock were one of twenty schools invited to play in this prestigious event. It was a privilege for captain Derry Moloney and his team of TY and 5th Year players to run out on The Close, where William Webb Ellis 'ran with the ball in his arms' for the first time 200 years ago. It was also an experience of a lifetime for the boys to meet and compete with young men from the four corners of the world in a game somewhat alien to us as a school.

We were fortunate to call upon the coaching expertise of past-pupil and current Ireland 7's international Bryan Mollen (Class of 2014) as we took on Uppingham from England (41-0), Llandovery from Wales (14-7), Waseda High School from Japan (46-0) and Michaelhouse from South Africa (24-12) on day one. It was a brutally demanding day, but one that the boys embraced and adapted to incredibly well.

Having topped our group on the first day, we qualified for the Cup on day two. We were placed in a small group of three with Monmouth School from Wales (36-0) and Mount St Mary's of England (24-7) which we overcame impressively to progress into the knockout phase and a quarter-final against the hugely talented Grange School from Chile who we defeated 17-7.

A semi-final with Scottish schools' champions Merchiston Castle awaited 40 minutes later, such is the demanding nature of these tournaments. It looked like it could be a bridge too far as they scored early and took a lead into halftime, but such was the resilience of the group, Derry and the team turned the scoreline on its head with an impressive 33-14 victory.

With schools from New Zealand, Australia, Japan and Canada amongst others watching on from the sideline, it was our South African opponents who stood between us and tournament victory, but it just wasn't to be. The power game of Michaelhouse proved just too much in the end for our twelve young men to overcome for a second time in 24 hours. Having been down 14-0 early in the first half, we fought

back to take an incredible lead 19-14, but a converted try with a few minutes remaining was too much for us to overcome.

It was an experience of a lifetime for these players and the way they played sevens for the first time at this level was quite remarkable. Well done everyone.


