Robert Waldinger is the Director of the Harvard Study of Adult Development, a comprehensive longitudinal piece of research that has tracked individuals and their families since 1938. I recommend that you join the 45 million others who have watched his TED Talk, 'What Makes a Good Life, lessons from the longest study on happiness.'

What this study has proven, scientifically, is that those who have the strongest connections to others be it family, friends or community fare best in terms of longevity, health and happiness. This is probably no surprise to you, certainly not to us, but it may be a surprise to our teenagers.

At Blackrock, we focus on the education of both the heart and the mind. In the words of Fr. O'Brolchain we Reach Out with Care and Kindness. We encourage the boys to take time for each other, for their families and for those in society who need a helping hand. We remind them that no gesture of good will is too small whether it is a greeting, a thank you, a smile.

We build connections in our classrooms, in our co-curricular and extra-curricular programmes in the belief that the boys want to be part of something worthwhile, something bigger than themselves, something with which they can identify. That something, more often than not, is 'someone', someone who cares, who appreciates them, makes them feel welcome.

We are mindful that there are boys at Blackrock who find it difficult to connect. We must work harder at this, find different ways to reach out to those who feel that they are on the outside looking in.

Viktor Franklin author of 'Man's Search for Meaning' wrote: - "what man actually needs is not a tensionless state but rather the striving and struggling for a worthwhile goal, a freely chosen task."

'Striving and struggling' is the Blackrock way – a realisation that things don't always go as we would like, but we keep going. We applaud the success of our tennis, table-tennis, soccer, athletics, rowing and badminton teams but we also appreciate those who show up, who strive and struggle without tangible reward.

Is there some secret to this? What makes us the way we are? It is no secret; our Christian values shape our community, encourage us to shy away from the easy option, to trust in God. We strive and struggle with our faith. We find frustration at times but also comfort. It shapes our search for meaning.

As another academic year comes to a close, I thank my colleagues for keeping Blackrock 'striving and struggling'. I particularly thank Anne Payne, Donal O'Nuallain, John Sheil, Brian Herlihy, Donal Brennan and Albert Beatty all of whom retire after tremendous service to the boys and the College.

I thank also Sarah McLoughlin who steps away after two years of stellar leadership as chair of the Parents' Council. Sarah leaves it in great shape and we wish Shea Clancy well as he picks up the baton.

Finally, it has been a pleasure to serve as Principal of Blackrock. I am indebted to so many, our Spiritan Community, my colleagues, you the parents, the union, my wife Vivienne and of course, the boys.







Junior Debating News



Blackrock College Junior Debaters competed against 150 students in the All-Ireland MACE on Saturday January 28th, 2023, in UCD. Hosted by the Literary and Historical Society, this is Ireland's premier junior debating competition and the only National event for those students in their Junior Cycle of secondary school. It is the qualifying event for the

International Competition for Young Debaters which was held in **Cambridge University** on April 30th, 2023. ICYD is a debating competition in the British Parliamentary Format that was set up to encourage younger students to take up debating and to give them a chance to debate against students of their own age. This is a unique opportunity for young debaters to compete on an international stage with other students of a similar age and skill-level.

With over 700 competitors competing from across the world (25 countries in total) in the regional rounds, Blackrock College's Josh Murphy and Jamie Browne-Lynch (3rd Year) successfully qualified to compete and debated along with 55 other teams on Finals Day, held at the historic Cambridge Union. The Union is one of the most prestigious debating societies in the world, with an unparalleled reputation for hosting renowned speakers from around the globe. Established over 195 years, the society has a long tradition of challenging thought and aiming to promote debate and discussion not just in Cambridge University, but around the world. Built in 1815, the Cambridge Union is the **oldest speaking Union in the world**, and has a rich history of controversial debates and influential speakers.

Update from Blackrock College Archives

In early May the Archive completed Phase I of the conservation of photographs and photograph montages hanging in common spaces in the college. Current and past students will be familiar with the photomontages which hang on the walls of Our Lady's Corridor and St Patrick's Corridor. Since the mid-20th century these were compiled retrospectively, to provide a visual account of the day-to-day life of the college, its community, noteworthy events and important developments which occurred in either five or ten-year periods of time.

An assessment of the eleven photomontages representing the period 1900-1955 confirmed that they were a compilation of traditional silver-halide photographs, printed in a darkroom on photosensitive paper. The silver emulsion coating on the paper remains photosensitive after it has been printed and is structurally very delicate. As such it is subject to discolouration, fading and even blistering when exposed to UV light. Hanging on a wall in Our Lady's Corridor directly across from windows filtering light directly from the quadrangle brought inevitable deterioration to the photographs.

Photographer and conservator David Cleary worked meticulously on each of these photomontages. The work he carried out on each photograph ranged from digital adjusting to retouching with photoshop. In some instances, where the damage was beyond repair and the original print could not be found, we had to source a replacement similar photograph. When this was complete, he produced a replica digital mount (imitating the layout and bevelled pattern of the original hard-copy mount) and recreated in a font similar to the original the titles and captions for each photograph. This was then sent to a printer where they were reproduced as giclée prints: archival pigment print on fine art fibre-based paper. This is a sustainable and very long-lasting printing finish, protecting the images from UV damage and deterioration.

We are delighted with the finished results. We will now move on to Phase 2: the conservation of the SCT framed photographs.




