To start, two classes visited Explorium, where they engaged in hands-on scientific activities, including the exhilarating experience of riding a G-Force bike. Meanwhile, another two classes went to Croke Park, where they embarked on the Skyline Tour, taking in breathtaking views, followed by an in-depth tour of the Croke Park Museum.

In addition, two other classes visited GoQuest, an adventure centre filled with escape rooms. Finally, the last two classes visited Awesome Walls, where students were divided into smaller groups and given the opportunity to try rock climbing.

Dave, a renowned herpetologist with years of experience working with reptiles, shared his knowledge on various reptile species, their habitats, behaviours, and conservation efforts. Students enjoyed meeting the python, tarantula, iguana, scorpion and snapping turtle.

Other science week events included: 2nd Year scavenger hunt, Chemistry magic show, 6th Year lectures from leaving certificate biology and chemistry examiners, 3rd year science table quiz, photography competition.
