## Leinster Senior Schools

Blackrock swimming delivered another stellar performance at the Leinster Senior Schools.

In the junior events, **Sam Ramke (2nd Year)**, **Jack McNamara (1st Year)**, and **Aidan Whitaker (1st Year)** dominated the relays, winning gold in both the 4x50 freestyle and medley. Strong individual performances saw Jack, Josh, and Sam finish in the top 10 of the 100m freestyle, Aidan place 10th in 100m breaststroke, and **George Gaskin (1st Year)** secure 5th in the 100m butterfly.

The intermediate boys also impressed, with James Kelly, Daire Hannon, Finn O'Reilly, and Nate LaMont (all 3rd Year) taking bronze in the 4x50 medley relay. Garry Kingston (3rd Year) contributed to a strong freestyle relay finish, while Daire, recovering from injury, placed 16th in the 400m freestyle.

The senior boys narrowly missed the podium in the 4x50 freestyle relay, despite strong swims. **Gerard Egan (5th Year)** delivered a solid breaststroke leg in the 4x50 medley relay.

With these performances, the team has earned spots at the Irish National Schools in April, where they'll aim for more success.
