Irish Indoor Rowing Championships 2025

Building on a successful 2024 campaign, the Rowing Team returned to the University of Limerick on January 18th for the 2025 Irish Indoor Rowing Championships. Ten rowers competed, with five securing medals.

The day started strong with **Garry Kingston (3rd Year)** dominating the J15 1000m race, retaining the National Championship previously won by **Jon-Luc Elias (4th Year)** in 2024. Garry also impressed with a 7th place finish in the 500m event.

Jon-Luc Elias earned a close second in the J16 2000m, just 0.8 seconds behind first place, while **Charlie Schmitt, Daniel Moran, Hugo Higgins, Andrew Clancy, and Oliver Hammersley (4th Year)** all put in strong performances.

Matthew Neary (6th Year) placed 11th in the highly competitive J18 2000m, with **Eoin Fitzpatrick (4th Year)** and **Ian Duane (5th Year)** also finishing strong. The day ended with a thrilling tie for first in the Men's Transition Year Relay.
