From pedigree livestock displays to cutting-edge farming technologies, students engaged with a living classroom that brought their studies to life in the most dynamic way possible.

It was a day filled with learning, inspiration, and a deeper appreciation for the role agriculture plays in shaping Ireland's economy, environment, and rural communities.

The week also featured a Climate Café, where students exchanged ideas and solutions, and a beach clean that reinforced our commitment to protecting local ecosystems.

From poetry to practical action, the week inspired students to reflect on their role in safeguarding the planet. It was a powerful reminder of our shared responsibility to nurture and protect the environment for future generations.


