# **Dean's Report**

The first half term — the longest of the academic year — has been a busy and vibrant one as the 2025/2026 school year has settled into full swing. Both inside and outside the classroom, students have been deeply engaged in a wide range of activities and events.

Our Clubs and Societies Day on September 9th showcased the remarkable breadth of extra-curricular opportunities available at the College. Highlights of the term so far have included a highly successful House 10s rugby competition with excellent participation, a closely fought Karl Ashe Memorial Trophy Tournament, the College Sailing Regatta, and the Swimming Gala. Over 200 students travelled to take part in the Sedbergh 500th Anniversary Rugby Festival, and many more have been active across numerous sporting pursuits.

In the arts, preparations are well underway for the **Senior Musical** – **The Addams Family**, which takes to the stage in November. Just before midterm, students also enjoyed the **annual Royal Russell MUN trip** to London. Looking ahead, **Rock-Ed** returns on **13th November**, and we continue to encourage all students to get involved in an extra-curricular activity after the break.

Beyond the extra-curricular sphere, this half term has seen a full calendar of College wide initiatives, including Environmental Action Week, Wellbeing Week (featuring Jersey Day), retreats for 3rd, 5th, and 6th Years, Maths Week, and the 3rd and 6th Year Family Masses. Study skills workshops have also supported students as they prepare for the challenges ahead.

Our Transition Year programme continues to provide a wealth of opportunities, with preparations for Blackrock College Radio (BCR) in

November gathering momentum. The **Weekly Application and Progress Cards** remain an important tool in celebrating success in the classroom and identifying areas for continued growth as we move towards the **Christmas Examinations**.

# **Webwise Youth Panel Meeting**














#### **Science Club**

Over the past few weeks, students in the Science Club have been busy exploring a wide range of activities designed to ignite their curiosity and deepen their understanding of the world around them. Whether you are fascinated by space, intrigued by dissections, or captivated by chemistry, Science Club truly has something for everyone!

In Week 1, students proudly submitted their entry to the *BT Young Scientist* & *Technology Exhibition*. Since then, they have taken part in a variety of exciting hands-on experiments across Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Engineering.


Students built model lungs and took part in a guided lung dissection, bringing textbook biology to life. In Chemistry, they reacted magnesium with acid to produce hydrogen gas — confirmed by the unmistakable 'squeaky pop' test! They also explored reaction rates through the iodine clock experiment, racing to slow the reaction precisely to 50 seconds.

Engineering and teamwork took centre stage during the spaghetti-and-marshmallow tower challenge, where students collaborated to design and construct the sturdiest structures using just two simple materials.

More interactive experiments, trips, and competitions are planned for the weeks ahead, offering even more opportunities to experience the wonders of science beyond the classroom.







# **Geography Field Trip**



Our 6th Year Geography students recently conducted their field study along the Glencree River in Co. Wicklow. The investigation focused on erosion processes at a meander, with students collecting a range of measurements and observations to assess the hypothesis that erosion is actively shaping the river's course.

It was a **productive and insightful day of firsthand learning**, giving students the opportunity to apply classroom theory to the real-world landscape.

From perfecting musical numbers to fine-tuning choreography and


character work, the enthusiasm and dedication of everyone involved have been outstanding. Excitement is building as opening night draws closer!

The images capture the energy of the races and the great spirit shown by all who took part. Well done again to all the swimmers for their efforts and achievements.




















# Sedbergh School's 500th Anniversary

From October 10th-12th, 216 students and staff from Blackrock College travelled to **Sedbergh School** to celebrate its remarkable 500th anniversary. It was a true honour for Blackrock to be the only school invited to take part in a nine-game rugby festival marking this historic occasion.

The weekend was about far more than just rugby — it was a celebration of friendship, camaraderie, and the strengthening of the long-standing bond between the two schools.

The trip began with an early 7:30 a.m. ferry crossing, followed by a visit to Anfield Stadium before settling into the hotel for the evening. On Friday night, 23 members of our Senior Panel, along with coaches, College management, and parents, attended a gala dinner at Sedbergh School. Both principals, **Ms. Markey** and **Mr. Harrison**, spoke eloquently about the enduring friendship between Blackrock and Sedbergh, and the shared educational values that unite them.

Saturday saw an early start as the first four matches kicked off at 11:30 a.m., followed by the next four at 12:45 p.m., culminating in the showcase fixture: Sedbergh School 1st XV vs Blackrock College 1st XV.

It was a truly memorable weekend — filled with competitive spirit, mutual respect, and lasting memories. With eight of our nine teams victorious, and countless friendships forged, the trip perfectly captured the spirit of sport, connection, and celebration that both schools hold dear.



























### Rowing

We are delighted to announce that **Jack Tuite** has been selected to represent Ireland at the **2025 Coupe Beach Sprint Regatta** in Cádiz, Spain, taking place from October 30th to November 2nd.

This prestigious international event brings together Europe's top junior rowers to compete in the fast-paced and dynamic discipline of Beach Sprint Rowing, which tests athletes' skill, endurance, and speed both on land and water.

Jack, who rows with **Neptune Rowing Club**, will join a talented team of junior athletes from across Ireland as they take on elite competitors from all over Europe.

We are incredibly proud of Jack's outstanding achievement and wish him - and the entire Irish team - the best of luck as they represent their country on the international stage.

#### **Gaelic Football**

**B**lackrock College recorded an impressive victory over **St. Mac Dara's** on a scoreline of 4-11 to 1-8 in their latest group game. The match began evenly, with both sides exchanging scores throughout the first half. Blackrock's only goal before the break came from **Ciaran Roche**, leaving the team narrowly trailing 1-5 to 1-6 at halftime.

The second half continued in a tightly contested fashion, with both teams battling hard for possession and territory. However, in the final ten minutes, Blackrock showed their class and composure to pull away. **Tom White** fired home a superb goal to give the team momentum before **William Davy** struck twice in quick succession to seal the win.

In defence, **Brody O'Reilly, Hugo Ryan**, and **Daniel Sheeran** were outstanding, cutting out several dangerous attacks and driving the team forward from the back. This robust performance gives Blackrock great confidence heading into their next two group fixtures against **St. Declan's** Cabra and **Clonkeen College** after the midterm break.

#### **Senior Soccer**

The Senior Soccer Team have begun the defence of their FAI Schools

Leinster Cup title in fine form, recording two impressive away victories.

The campaign kicked off with a preliminary-round fixture against **Blessington Community College**. While the 4–0 scoreline may flatter slightly, the contest was far more competitive than it suggests. The team showed real quality and composure, opening the scoring after just two minutes and adding further goals early in the second half before sealing the win late on as Blessington pressed for a reply.

In the first-round, 'Rock faced a spirited **St. Michael's College** side. An early strike from **Sam Long** (6th Year) gave us the lead, but St. Michael's levelled from the penalty spot in the 38th minute. The response was immediate — **Jack Kelly** (6th Year) restored our advantage before **Long** struck again to make it 3–1 at half-time. Two quick goals after the break put the result beyond doubt, though St. Michael's rallied late to narrow the gap, with Blackrock emerging 5–3 winners after an entertaining encounter.

The squad now look ahead to their next challenge — an away trip to **CBS Kilkenny** after the midterm break — eager to maintain their momentum and continue their strong title defence.
